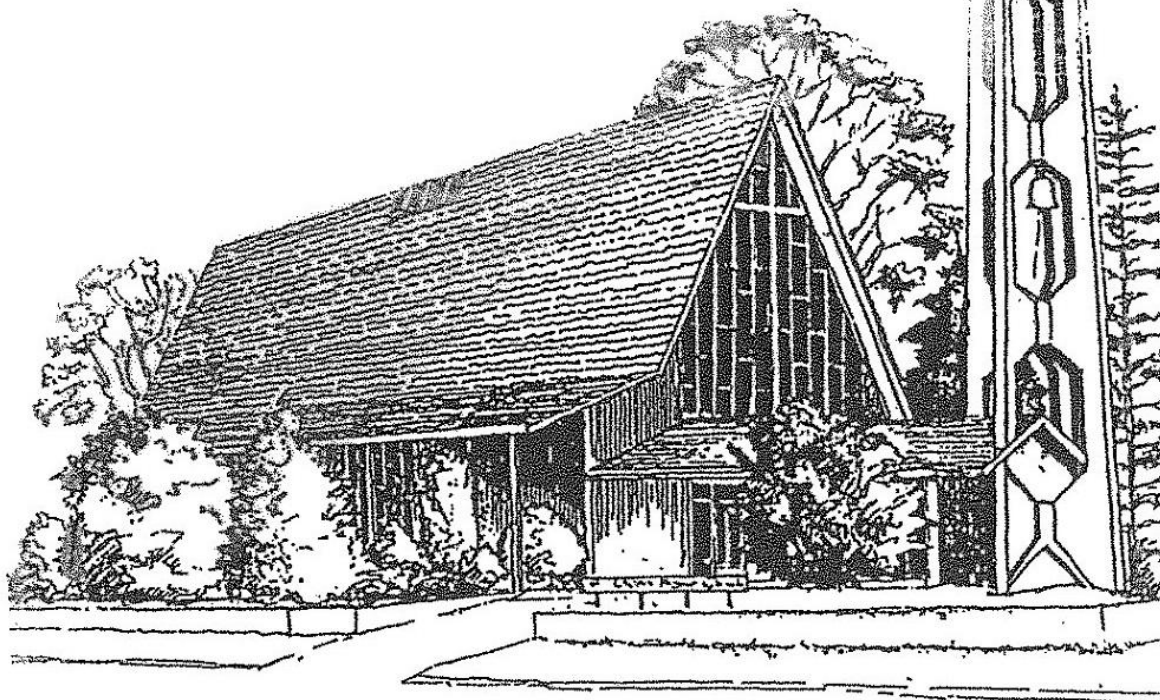

FROM THE MINISTER

Greetings and welcome to the new year. I can't believe it's February already!

Every new year, my five NZ siblings and our offspring gather in Auckland on New Years Day. We number about 40 altogether. A time capsule in the shape of a rocket is produced and opened. Inside the hollow rocket are the resolutions we each made at the previous New Years gathering. There's a lot of laughter and applause as we hear the year-old resolutions read out by each 'resolver'. We are allowed three goals each - which are divided into 'spiritual', 'physical' and 'intellectual' goals. Some of us even surprise ourselves by achieving all three of our projected goals. Others are disappointed and others give us a laugh by setting impossible goals – like 'being a billionaire by next year'. We are given a new slip of paper and a pen for this year's resolutions. They are placed in the time capsule and stored away for another year.

I find setting goals is useful. Without goals we become like a ship that is headed out into the ocean with no destination and no charts. A ship with no purpose and direction. Going nowhere fast.

Church is like that too. We need to plan and set goals for the next three to five years. We hope to do that later this year with the help of a facilitator. We hope as many of you as possible to take part.

PCANZ Ministers are required to have three-year goals. My goals are: 1. Keep fit. 2. Write a book. 3. Do a university paper each year for the next 3 years.

I would urge you to earnestly pray for the parish, for myself, our leadership and all members. That we may come up with some worthy goals that reflect the Life of Christ among us. Goals that will benefit our community and not just the church. Goals that will help us to know Christ more and make Him known.

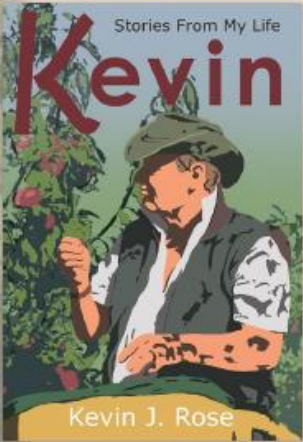
BLOKES BREAKFAST

To keep the shop well-stocked and welcoming, we would greatly appreciate fresh donations of good-quality books in the immediate future. When we say *high quality*, we simply mean books in clean, saleable condition. From time to time, we receive items that have been damaged, water-exposed, or affected by mould. Unfortunately, once mould sets in, the book cannot be sold and must be discarded. Your help in checking donations before dropping them off makes a tremendous difference to the shop's operation and to our volunteers' time.

10th Anniversary Celebration – Mini Book Festival

This year marks the 10th Anniversary of the opening of our Columba Bookshop—an exciting milestone for our church community. To celebrate, we are hoping to hold a Mini Book Festival, on a Saturday morning in May or June. More details will follow as plans take shape.

As always, we welcome the creativity and wisdom of our volunteer team. If you have ideas for festival activities, displays, readings, or ways to involve the wider community, we would love to hear them. To gather suggestions and begin shaping the programme, we will hold a volunteers' planning meeting in February. A date will be confirmed shortly.

A highlight of the festival will be readings from *Tall Tales*—Judith's first book about the shop—as well as readings from her new book, which is due for release around the same time. These will be wonderful opportunities to celebrate the stories, people, and spirit that have shaped the shop over the past decade.
